On July 4, 1776, a band of patriots risked everything for the idea that “all men are created equal.” Knowing that confronting a colonial superpower was an act of treason, the Founders nevertheless pledged their “lives, fortunes and sacred honor” to create something bigger than themselves. We pause to thank the brave Americans who serve in our military. Their sacrifice, and the sacrifice of their families, reminds us every day that our freedom is not free. We also take time to recommit ourselves to the work that remains to realize the Declaration’s ideals of liberty and equality for all Americans.

Let us summon the courage that drove our Founders then, and the courage that drives all those who fight for America’s promise today, as we continue to protect one another from the ongoing threat of COVID-19 and work to build a brighter future for all.
