Each member and employee shall disclose his economic interests in the region within ten (10) days after taking his seat on the governing board or being employed by the agency and shall thereafter disclose any further economic interest which he acquires, as soon as feasible after he acquires it. (Gov. Code § 66801, Art. 3(a)(5).)

Members appointed by the Speaker of the Assembly or the Senate Rules Committee may, subject to confirmation by the appointing power, designate an alternate to attend meetings and vote in the absence of the appointed member. CALIFORNIA YOUTH EMPOWERMENT COMMISSION

<u>Purpose:</u> The commission's main purpose is to provide meaningful opportunities for actual civic engagement to improve the quality of life for California's disconnected and disadvantaged youth. Furthermore, youths involved with the commission will make meaningful recommendations regarding legislation and policies that impact their own lives and the lives of millions of other youths in California whose voices often go unheard.

Authority: GC § 8263

<u>Appointing Power</u>: Governor –11 Senate Rules Committee – 1 Speaker of the Assembly – 1 Ex-officio members – 5

Number: 13 voting commissioners, 18 members (Gov Code § 8263 (a))

<u>Governor's Appointments</u>- Each of the eleven public members appointed by the Governor are subject to the following:

Qualifications:

One of the commissioners shall reside, work, or attend school in each region described below, with the exception of the at-large commissioner. (Gov Code § 8263 (a) (1)(B))

Five of the commissioners shall be between 14 to 18 years of age. (Gov Code § 8263 (a) (1)(C))

Five of the commissioners shall be between 18 to 25 years of age. (Gov Code § 8263 (a) (1)(D))

At least five commissioners shall have experienced a physical disability, youth homelessness, foster care, or juvenile incarceration. (Gov Code § 8263 (a) (1)(E))

One at-large commissioner, who may be between 14 to 25 years of age. (Gov Code § 8263 (a) (1)(F))

The Governor may appoint alternates for the 11 commissioners. In the event of a vacancy, the alternate will fill the position, and the appointing power that appointed the commissioner shall appoint a new alternate in the same manner as the original appointment within 60 days of the vacancy.

<u>Senate Rules</u>- One at-large public member appointed by the Senate Committee on Rules. (Gov Code § 8263 (a) (2))

<u>Speaker of the Assembly</u>-One at-large public member appointed by the Speaker of the Assembly. (Gov Code § 8263 (a) (3))

Regions are defined as follows:

- 1. The Superior California region consists of the Counties of Butte, Colusa, El Dorado, Glenn, Lassen, Modoc, Nevada, Placer, Plumas, Sacramento, Shasta, Sierra, Siskiyou, Sutter, Tehama, Yolo, and Yuba.
- 2. The North Coast region consists of the Counties of Del Norte, Humboldt, Lake, Mendocino, Napa, Sonoma, and Trinity.
- 3. The San Francisco Bay area region consists of the Counties of Alameda, Contra Costa, Marin, San Mateo, Santa Clara, and Solano, and the City and County of San Francisco.
- 4. The Northern San Joaquin Valley region consists of the Counties of Alpine, Amador, Calaveras, Madera, Mariposa, Merced, Mono, San Joaquin, Stanislaus, and Tuolumne.
- 5. The Central Coast region consists of the Counties of Monterey, San Benito, San Luis Obispo, Santa Barbara, Santa Cruz, and Ventura.
- 6. The Southern San Joaquin Valley region consists of the Counties of Fresno, Inyo, Kern, Kings, and Tulare.
- 7. The Inland Empire region consists of the Counties of Riverside and San Bernardino.
- 8. The Los Angeles region consists of the County of Los Angeles.
- 9. The Orange County region consists of the County of Orange.
- 10. The San Diego/Imperial region consists of the Counties of Imperial and San Diego.

A commissioner shall be a resident of California. (Gov Code § 8264 (c))

All appointing powers shall take into consideration that the members of the commission represent the geographical, racial, ethnic, socioeconomic, cultural, physical, and educational diversity of California's youth. Particular emphasis and funding should be used on reaching out to at-risk or disadvantaged youth to serve as members of the commission, as their participation will provide keen insight into many of the issues that youth face in their day-to-day lives. (Gov Code § 8263 (d))

Term:

Commissioners shall serve 2 year terms, excluding the initial staggering of terms. The terms of the 11 Governor appointed commissioners initially shall be staggered so that five members serve one-year terms and six members serve two-year terms. (Gov Code § 8263 (a) (1) (A)).

Commissioners shall be between 14 and 25 years of age. If a commissioner turns 26 years of age during their term, that commissioner shall be allowed to complete the term. (Gov Code § 8264 (b))

CALIFORNIA YOUTH EMPOWERMENT COMMISSION (continued)

A commissioner may seek reappointment as long as they fulfill the requirements. (Gov Code § 8264 (d))

- Term Limits: Not stated in statute
- Grace Period: Not stated in statute
- Compensation: \$100 per diem and travel expenses while on official business of the commission (Gov Code § 8266)
- Meetings: The commission shall conduct full commission meetings at least every other month, with the first meeting in August 2022, or not later than eight months after funding is made available for this purpose. (Gov Code § 8270)
- Bond: Not stated in statute.
- Oath: Government Code §§ 1360 1363.
- Duties: The Commission shall be an advisory Commission only. There shall be no right or obligation on the part of the state, or parties meeting and conferring, to implement the findings of the commission without further legislation that specifically authorizes that the evaluations, determinations, and findings of the commission be implemented.

The commission shall do the following:

Examine and discuss policy and fiscal issues affecting the interests, needs, and conditions of the youth of California.

Formally advise and make recommendations to the Legislature, Superintendent of Public Instruction, and Governor on specific legislative and fiscal issues affecting youth, such as the achievement gap, behavioral and physical health, bullying, career preparation, child welfare, child and sexual abuse, civic engagement, climate crisis, college affordability and student loans. depression and suicide, education, employment, financial literacy, foster care, gun violence, health care, homelessness, housing and transportation, immigration and undocumented youth, juvenile justice, labor and jobs, LGBTQ civil rights, mental health, poverty, racial, economic, and gender equity, reproductive justice, safety, social media and networking, substance abuse and vaping, youth development, and any other policy or fiscal issues deemed appropriate by the commission.

CALIFORNIA YOUTH EMPOWERMENT COMMISSION (continued)

Consult with any existing local-level youth advisory commissions and community-based, grassroots youth-led organizations for input and potential solutions on issues related to youth.

Publish an internet website to report details relevant to the commission for the public to view, including, but not limited to, commission agendas, minutes, resolutions, vote counts, initiatives, commissioner information, photos, and video.

On or before January 1, 2024, and annually thereafter, publish an annual report to the Legislature, Superintendent of Public Instruction, Secretary of California Health and Human Services, and Governor detailing the activities, issues, demographics, budget, and outcomes of the commission. (Gov Code § 8272 (a-e))
