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CALIFORNIA ACCESS TO JUSTICE COMMISSION

<u>AUTHORITY:</u>	Government Code, §68655 (Amended by: Ch. 34 of 2023, SB 133 - Committee on Budget); Business & Professions, §6141.3 (Created/Amended by: Ch. 698 of 2019, SB 176 - Jackson)
<u>APPOINTING POWERS:</u>	Governor; President pro Tempore of the Senate; Speaker of the Assembly
<u>NUMBER:</u>	7 Members Governor 2 - members President pro Tempore of the Senate 1 - member Speaker of the Assembly 1 - member Judicial Council 3 - members Pursuant to its bylaws, the Commission may appoint additional members, who shall be approved by the members.
<u>QUALIFICATIONS:</u>	The appointing authorities shall, in making appointments, make every effort to ensure that there is a geographic balance of representation, and that the members will include a broad representation of organizations and communities who participate in or are affected by the provision of civil justice in California.
<u>TERM:</u>	The term of each commission member shall be 4 years. Each appointing authority may reappoint a member whose term has expired and shall fill any vacancy for the unexpired portion of the term in which it occurs. All appointees may continue their term until the appointment of their successors, subject to their compliance with attendance provisions. Members shall attend at least 50 percent of all duly convened meetings in a calendar year, unless the absence has been excused by the executive director. A member who fails to attend at least 50 percent of all duly convened meetings of the commission in a calendar year forfeits membership on the commission, unless the absence has been excused by the executive director.
<u>COMPENSATION:</u>	Members shall be uncompensated volunteers. Members may be reimbursed for reasonable expenses incurred in participating if the funds available to the commission permit.
<u>PURPOSE:</u>	The California Access to Justice Commission advances access to justice for all Californians by expanding resources, removing barriers, and developing innovations so everyone can effectively and efficiently

CALIFORNIA ACCESS TO JUSTICE COMMISSION-continued

resolve their civil legal issues.

COMMENT:

SB 133 (Committee on Budget) of 2023 codified the California Access to Justice Commission to provide leadership in efforts to achieve full and equal access to justice for all Californians.

The commission shall meet as often as required, but at least twice per year.

QUALIFICATIONS:

In appointing the seven licensee members, the Governor shall appoint individuals representing a cross section of the accounting profession.

No public member shall be a current or former licensee of the board or an immediate family member of a licensee, or be currently or formerly employed by a public accounting firm, bookkeeping firm, or firm engaged in providing tax preparation as its primary business, or have any financial interest in the business of a licensee. Each public member shall meet all of the requirements for public membership on the board as set forth in Chapter 6 (commencing with Section 450) of Division 1.

Each member shall be a citizen of the United States and a resident of this state for at least five years preceding appointment, and shall be of good character.

TERM:

4 years, running with the office, and until appointment and qualification

of successor, or until one year since expiration of the term, whichever occurs first. Vacancies occurring shall be filled by appointment for the unexpired term. No person shall serve more than two consecutive terms. The appointing authority may remove from office at any time a member of the board appointed by the appointing authority for continued neglect of duties required by law, or for incompetence, or unprofessional or dishonorable conduct.

COMPENSATION: \$100 per diem & expenses (B&P Sec. 103)

PURPOSE: Establish and maintain entry standards of qualification and conduct; administer the national CPA examination; certify, issue and renew licenses.

COMMENT: Sunset extended to 01/01/2029, pursuant to AB 3251 (Berman) of 2024.

AB 1704 created another public slot for the Gov. starting in 1-1-84. AB 207 of 2002 increased the board from 11 to 15 by adding 1 licensee (appointed by the Governor) and 3 public members (1 each appointed by Senate Rules, Speaker and Governor).

AB 1659 (Huber) and AB 2130 (Huber) of 2010 repealed Division 1.2 of the B&P Code and established the Joint Sunset Review Committee and subjected the Board to review.

SB 1467 (Cmte on Business, Professions and Economic Development) of 2014 eliminated the specific qualifiers for licensee appointees and instead provided that the Governor shall appoint individuals representing a cross section of the accounting profession.

AB 1521 (Low, Chap. 359, Sts. of 2019) extended the sunset to 01/01/2024. AB 496 (Low) of 2019 authorizes the Senate Rules Committee and Assembly Speaker to remove a board member for cause, as specified.

SB 1443 (Roth) of 2022 extended the previous sunset to 01/01/2025.

<u>APPOINTING POWERS:</u>	Governor; Senate Rules Committee; Speaker of the Assembly
<u>NUMBER:</u>	8 Members Senate Rules Committee 1 - actuary (R1) Speaker of the Assembly 1 - actuary (S1) Governor 2 - actuaries One member each appointed by: Teachers' Retirement Board Board of Administration of the Public Employees' Retirement System State Association of County Retirement Systems Board of Regents of the University of California
<u>QUALIFICATIONS:</u>	Each member of the panel shall be an actuary who has attained the designation of Associate or Fellow of the Society of Actuaries and who has demonstrated experience with public sector clients.
<u>TERM:</u>	3 years. An initial term of 2 years will be assigned to the members appointed by the Senate Rules Committee, Regents of the University of California and 1 of the Governor's appointments.
<u>COMPENSATION:</u>	Reimbursement for expenses will be paid by the authority that appointed the member.
<u>PURPOSE:</u>	Provide impartial and independent information on pension, other postemployment benefits, and best practices to public agencies. Responsibilities are to include, but are not limited to: defining the range of actuarial model policies and best practices for public retirement; develop pricing and disclosure standards for public sector benefit improvement; develop quality control standards for public sector actuaries; gather model funding policies and practices; reply to policy questions from public retirement systems; and provide comment upon request by public agencies.
<u>COMMENT:</u>	The Panel will be located in the Controller's office, which shall provide support staff and will meet quarterly. Six meetings anticipated for 2022.

<u>APPOINTING POWERS:</u>	Governor, with Senate confirmation; Senate Rules Committee; Speaker of the Assembly
<u>NUMBER:</u>	7 Members Governor 3 - Acupuncturists with five years experience (G5) 2 - public (G6) Senate Rules Committee 1 - public (R2) Speaker of Assembly 1 - public (S2)
<u>QUALIFICATIONS:</u>	Public members shall not hold a license or certificate as a physician and surgeon or acupuncturist. Acupuncturist members shall be appointed to represent a cross section of the cultural backgrounds of licensed members of the acupuncturist profession.
<u>TERM:</u>	4 years expiring on June 1 (per B&P Code 130). No more than two consecutive full terms. The appointing authority has the power to remove from office any board member appointed by the appointing authority for continued neglect of duties required by law, or for incompetence, or unprofessional or dishonorable conduct. Prior to 1999, terms were 3 years.
<u>COMPENSATION:</u>	\$100 per diem and expenses
<u>PURPOSE:</u>	Issues licenses to qualified practitioners, approves and monitors students in tutorial programs, approves acupuncture schools that have

been accredited, as specified, and continuing education providers, adopts regulations and enforces the Acupuncture Licensure Act.

COMMENT:

Sunsets 01/01/2028 pursuant to AB 1264 (Berman), Chapter 682 of 2023.

SB 248 of 2005 repealed board as of 1/1/06. Same bill reestablished board with 7 members. Appointing powers may appoint to the board a person who was a member of the prior board prior to the repeal on 1/1/06.

Confirmation of Governor appointees started 1/1/90. SB 1980 of 1998 eliminated 2 positions, 1 physician to be eliminated 1/1/99 and 1 acupuncture to be eliminated 1/1/00 (both appointed by Governor). SB 1951 of 2002 eliminated 1 acupuncturist w/5 years experience and added 1 acupuncturist who is also a faculty member.

AB 2130 (Huber) and AB 1659 (Huber) of 2010 repealed Div. 1.2 of the B&P Code and established the Joint Sunset Review Committee and made the Board subject to review.

AB 496 (Low) of 2019 authorizes the Senate Rules Committee and Assembly Speaker to remove a board member for cause, as specified.

<u>APPOINTING POWERS:</u>	Governor; Senate Rules Committee; Speaker of the Assembly
<u>NUMBER:</u>	7 Members - Governor 1 - public 1 - representative of victims rights groups 1 - representative of chief probation officers - Senate Rules Committee 1 - public - Speaker of the Assembly 1 - public - Judicial Council 1 - superior court judge - Director of Corrections or his/her designee
<u>QUALIFICATIONS:</u>	
<u>TERM:</u>	4 years, except for Director of Corrections or his/her designee who serves a pleasure term. (originally appointments were for 2 years SB 330 of 2002 changed to 4)
<u>COMPENSATION:</u>	Reasonable per diem expenses related to work for council purposes.
<u>PURPOSE:</u>	The council shall exercise oversight and advocacy concerning its participation in Interstate Commission activities, and other duties as may be determined by the Legislature or Governor, including but not limited to, development of policy concerning operations and procedures of the compact within the state. Shall, not later than July 1, 2005, submit a report to the Legislature on the status of implementing the Interstate Compact for Adult Offender Supervision in California. The report shall clearly differentiate the role and responsibilities of the state Compact Administrator from local supervisory agencies and shall articulate the interdependence between the state Compact Administrator and other related entities, including, but not limited to, local supervisory agencies. Additionally, the report shall identify the process by which the State Council communicates with county probation offices and Superior courts to ensure the state's compliance with the Interstate Compact for Adult Offender Supervision.
<u>COMMENT:</u>	The Director of Corrections or his/her designee shall also serve as the commissioner, who represents California and serves on the Interstate

Commission for Adult Offender Supervision and shall also be the Compact Administrator for the State of California for purposes of the Interstate Compact for Adult Offender Supervision.

The Interstate Compact for Adult Offender Supervision would, if adopted by at least 35 states, create a commission to monitor and govern the movement of adult criminal parolees and probationers as they move among the 50 states and territories.

The State Council for Interstate Adult Offender Supervision also serves as the State Council for Interstate Juvenile Offender Supervision.

<u>QUALIFICATIONS:</u>	The Commission shall be comprised of a majority of members 60 years of age or older. It shall be comprised of actual consumers and providers of services under the federal Older Americans Act, with professional, lived, or academic expertise both within and outside of the field of aging, including, but not limited to, health, behavioral health, Alzheimer's and related dementias, long-term services and supports, long-term care, housing, transportation, independent living, workforce development, caregiving, elder justice, information technology, and economic security, among others. Appointees must represent geographic, cultural, economic and other social factors in the State. At least 2 of the 12 persons shall be appointed by the Governor from nominees submitted by, among others, area agency on aging directors and the Area Agency on Aging Advisory Council of California, also known as the Triple-A Council of California. A commission member who fails to attend two consecutive monthly meetings or who fails to attend nine meetings per year, without having given written excuse acceptable to the commission, shall cause the commission to notify the appointing authority, and the appointing authority may declare the position vacant.
<u>TERM:</u>	3 years - no more than 2 terms.
<u>COMPENSATION:</u>	Necessary expenses

PURPOSE: Serve as the principal advocate body for older persons, including but not limited to advisory participation in the consideration of all legislation and regulations made by state and federal departments and agencies relating to programs and services that affect older individuals; participate with the department in training workshops; prepare, publish, and disseminate information, findings and recommendations regarding the well-being of older individuals; actively participate and advise the department in the development and preparation of State Plan on Aging; meet and consult with the Area Agency on Aging Advisory Councils.

<u>APPOINTING POWERS:</u>	Senate Rules Committee; Speaker of the Assembly
<u>NUMBER:</u>	9 Members - Senate Rules Committee 1 - Biostatistician (R1) 1 - Physician or scientist specializing in occupational medicine (R2) - Speaker of Assembly 1 - Toxicologist (S1) 1 - Biochemist (S2) - Secretary, Environmental Protection Agency 1 - Pathologist 1 - Oncologist 1 - Epidemiologist 1 - Atmospheric scientist 1 - Shall have relevant scientific experience and shall be experienced in the operation of scientific review for advisory bodies.
<u>QUALIFICATIONS:</u>	Members shall be highly qualified and professionally active or engaged in scientific research. Members shall be appointed and reappointed from a pool of nominees submitted to each appointing body by the President of the University of California. The pool shall include, at a minimum, nominees for each discipline represented on the panel, and shall include only individuals who hold, or have held, academic or equivalent appointments at universities and their affiliates in California.
<u>TERM:</u>	3 years. AB 3792 of 1986 provided for staggered terms. One Senate Rules appointee's and one Speaker appointee's term shall be extended to 1/1/88 as designated by Senate Rules and Speaker respectively. The other appointees terms shall expire on 1/1/87.
<u>COMPENSATION:</u>	\$100 per day for attending panel meetings and meetings of the State Board plus actual and necessary travel expenses.
<u>PURPOSE:</u>	To advise the Air Resources Board and the Department of Pesticide Regulation in their evaluation of the health effects of toxic contaminants in the air.
<u>COMMENT:</u>	Meetings are scheduled when scientific reports are submitted to the Panel for peer review from the Air Resources Board. Historically Panel meets two to four times per year.

COMMENT:

SB 1052 (Kamlager) of 2022 provides that the purposes of the conservancy additionally include acquiring and managing public lands within the southern Ballona Creek Watershed and Upper Dominguez Channel area, and renamed the conservancy the Baldwin Hills and Urban Watersheds Conservancy. The bill also repealed the January 1, 2026, sunset date, thereby extending the act indefinitely and increased the number of voting members from 13 to 15 and the number of nonvoting members from 7 to 12.

A quorum shall consist of eight voting members of the board, and any action of the board affecting any matter before the board shall be decided by a majority vote of the voting members present, a quorum being present. However, the affirmative vote of at least five of the voting members of the board shall be required for the transaction of any business of the board.

COMMENT:

Through 1982, the Governor appointed 6 public members. Beginning in 1983, the Senate Rules Committee and Speaker of the Assembly will each appoint 1 public member and the Governor will appoint 4. SB 163 (Evans), Chapter 417, Statutes of 2011 changed the name from State Bar Board of Governors to State Bar Board of Trustees, stated legislative intent that the board reduce its membership from 23 to 19 by 10/31/14 and develop a transition plan effective 1/1/12. It also changes the process for selecting attorney members, and adds one attorney member appointed by the Rules Committee and one attorney member appointed by the Speaker. The bill provided that the board shall not change, reduce, shorten, lengthen or abolish the terms of board members commencing prior to 12/31/11, or force any board member to resign in order to reduce the membership. It also added conflict of interest provisions.

SB 36 (Jackson) of 2017 separated the State Bar's association duties from its regulatory duties. It removed the provision that requires certain

terms to commence at the conclusion of the State Bar's annual convention, thereby allowing terms to begin immediately upon appointment. It also stated legislative intent that the 19-member board transition to a 13-member board by 10/31/20, by allowing the 6 elected attorney members' terms to expire and not replacing them. It changed terms from 3 to 4 years. Further, it codified current practice that at least one board member appointed by each of the appointing authorities also serve on the executive committee. It also provided that, effective 1/1/18, one public member shall be appointed each by the Senate Rules Committee and the Speaker, and 4 public members shall be appointed by the Governor.

AB 2958 (Cmte on Judiciary) Chap. 419, Stats of 2022, provided that the time served during the remainder of a midterm vacancy by any member appointed to fill that vacancy shall not count toward any term limits for the member filling the vacancy.

SB 40 (Umberg) Chap. 697, Stats of 2023, expanded conflict of interest provisions for State Bar board members and employees, applying them to any decision of the State Bar.

AB 3279 (Committee on Judiciary) of 2024 authorizes an appointing authority to remove its appointee from office at any time for continued neglect of duties, incompetence, or unprofessional or dishonorable conduct.

AB 1527 (Jones-Sawyer) of 2018 clarifies that members may be removed by their appointing authorities.

AB 97 (Cmte on Budget) of 2019 provides that the panel is within the Business, Consumer Services, and Housing Agency.

AB 1872 (Cmte on Budget) Chap 93, Stats of 2020, changed the limitation on residency requirements to only panel members appointed by the Governor.
