<u>QUALIFICATIONS:</u>	A person appointed to the commission shall have demonstrated expertise and meet criteria in at least one of the following areas: (A) Analyzing, implementing, or developing public policies that impact racial equity as it relates to at least one of the following areas: broadband, climate change, disability rights, education, food insecurity, housing, immigration, land use, employment, environment, economic security, public health, health care, wealth, policing, criminal justice, transportation, youth leadership, agriculture, the wealth gap, entrepreneurship, arts and culture, voting rights, and public safety that may have an impact on racial equity or racial disparities; (B) Developing or using data or budget equity assessment tools; (C) Providing technical assistance in developing and implementing strategies for racial equity, including, but not limited to, guidance on employee training and support, development of racial equity programming, and assistance to organizations and departments on changing policies and practices to improve racial equity outcomes; (D) Be a member of, or represent an equity-focused organization who works with, an impacted community whose lived experience will inform the work of the office, including, but not limited to, members of the disability, immigrant, women's, and LGBTQ communities. Appointees must be residents of California. Appointing authorities shall consider the expertise of the other members of the commission and make appointments that reflect the cultural, ethnic, racial, linguistic, sexual orientation, gender identity, immigrant experience, socioeconomic, age, disability, and geographical diversity of the state so that the commission reflects the

communities of California.

<u>TERM:</u>	2 years
<u>COMPENSATION:</u>	Commission members shall serve without compensation, but they may be reimbursed for actual, pre-approved expenses incurred in connection with their duties.
<u>PURPOSE:</u>	To develop resources, best practices, and tools for advancing racial equity.
<u>COMMENT:</u>	Executive Order N-16-22 of 2022 established the 11-member Racial Equity Commission within the Governor's Office of Planning and Research (OPR), and directed OPR to request that the Senate Committee on Rules appoint two members and the Assembly Speaker appoint two members. AB 127 (Committee on Budget) of 2023 codified the Commission; "required" rather than "requested" that legislative appointments be made; slightly modified the qualifications for appointments; added a 1/1/30 sunset; and set the deadline for its first report on or after 12/1/25, but no later than 4/1/26. SB 164 (Committee on Budget) of 2024 reorganizes OPR into two new entities and places the Commission within the Governor's Office of Land Use and Climate Innovation. The bill also extends deadlines for Commission deliverables, making the racial equity framework now due to the Legislature no later than December 1, 2025. It also specifies that the Commission's first report to the Legislature is due no later than December 31, 2026, and annually no later than December 31 thereafter.

<u>NUMBER:</u>	11 Members Senate Rules Committee 2 - public (R1) 1 - Senator (ex officio) (R2) Speaker of the Assembly 2 - public (S1) 1 - Assemblymember (ex officio) (S2) Governor 5 - public (G1)
<u>QUALIFICATIONS:</u>	The Governor, the Senate Committee on Rules, and the Speaker of the Assembly shall take into consideration geographical diversity to ensure that all regions of the state are adequately represented.
<u>TERM:</u>	4 years, except for Speaker appointments which shall be pleasure, and ex officio members who shall serve pleasure terms. Vacancies on term appointments shall be filled for remainder of term. To provide for evenly staggered terms, persons appointed or reappointed after 1/1/2001 shall be appointed to initial terms to expire as follows: Of the Governor's five appointees, one shall be appointed to a term which expires on 12/31/2002; one to a term which expires 12/31/2003; one to a term which expires on 12/31/2004; and two to terms which expire on 12/31/2005. Of the Senate Rules Committee's two appointees, one shall be appointed to a term which expires on 12/31/2002, and one to a term which expires on 12/31/2004. Of the Speaker of the Assembly's two appointees, one shall be appointed to a term which expires on 12/31/2003, and one to a term which expires on 2005. Following the expiration of each of these initial terms, the term for each position shall expire every four years thereafter on December 31.

HIGH-SPEED RAIL AUTHORITY-continued

COMPENSATION: \$100 per diem, not to exceed \$500 in one calendar month, plus actual travel expenses incurred in attending to the business of the authority.

PURPOSE: The Authority shall direct the development and implementation of intercity high-speed rail service that is fully integrated with the state's existing intercity rail and bus networks and prepare a plan for the construction and operation of a high-speed train network for the state, consistent with and continuing the work of the Intercity High-Speed Rail Commission. They shall also conduct engineering and other studies, evaluate alternative high-speed rail technologies, establish criteria for awarding of a franchise, select a proposed franchisee, route and terminal sites and prepare a detailed financing plan.

COMMENT: AB 1813 (Frazier) of 2016 added one member of the Senate and one member of the Assembly as ex officio members.

AB 1831 (Cmte on Budget) of 2018 changed the Speaker appointments to pleasure terms.

SB 198 (Cmte on Budget) of 2022 created the High-Speed Rail Authority Office of the Inspector General. This position is not subject to confirmation.

TASK FORCE TO STUDY AND DEVELOP REPARATION PROPOSALS FOR AFRICAN AMERICANS

Identify, compile, and synthesize the relevant corpus of evidentiary documentation of the institution of slavery that existed within the United States and the colonies that became the United States from 1619 to 1865, inclusive. The task force shall examine all components as set forth in Gov. Code Sec, 8301.1 (b)(1) (A) - (H). The task force shall also make

recommendations including appropriate ways to educate the California public of its findings.

The Task Force shall submit a written report of its findings and recommendations to the Legislature no later than the date that is one year after the date of the first meeting of the Task Force.

Sunsets July 1, 2023.

Governor shall call the first meeting of the Task Force to occur no later than June 1, 2021. Five members constitutes a quorum. Task Force shall elect a chair and vice chair from among its members.

AB 46 (Luz Rivas), Ch. 660, Statutes of 2021 created the California Youth Empowerment Commission, an advisory body. The commission shall conduct full commission meetings at least every other month, with the first meeting in August 2022, and a sunset date of 1/1/27.

Initial funding was provided in the 2022 budget.

AB 127 (Committee on Budget) of 2023 placed the Commission within the Office of Planning and Research (OPR) and extended the deadline for the first meeting to on or before August 2023. The bill also extended the sunset to 1/1/30.

SB 164 (Committee on Budget) of 2024 reorganizes OPR into two new entities and moves the Commission, effective July 1, 2024, into the Governor's Office of Service and Community Engagement. It also extends the deadline for the first meeting of the Commission to be held on or before September 2024 and makes the implementation of the California Youth Empowerment Act subject to appropriation by the Legislature.
