Douglas Doty, a resident of Alabama and former resident of California, has applied for executive clemency.

On April 17, 1995, the Superior Court of California, County of Placer, sentenced Mr. Doty to three years of probation and one year in jail for possession of a controlled substance for sale.


Mr. Doty submitted a formal application for executive clemency in the form of a gubernatorial pardon. He has provided evidence that he is living an upright life and has demonstrated his fitness for restoration of civic rights and responsibilities.

This act of clemency for Mr. Doty does not minimize or forgive his conduct or the harm it caused. It does recognize the work he has done since to transform himself.

By the laws of this state it is proper that I, as Governor of the State of California, give testimony that, by completion of his sentence and good conduct in the community, Mr. Doty merits this pardon.

Filiberto Guardado

Filiberto Guardado, a resident of California, has applied for executive clemency.

On March 6, 2015, the Superior Court of California, County of San Bernardino, sentenced Mr. Guardado to three years of probation and 90 days in jail for possession of marijuana for sale. The court subsequently reduced the felony conviction to a misdemeanor.


Mr. Guardado submitted a formal application for executive clemency in the form of a gubernatorial pardon. He has provided evidence that he is living an upright life and has demonstrated his fitness for restoration of civic rights and responsibilities.

This act of clemency for Mr. Guardado does not minimize or forgive his conduct or the harm it caused. It does recognize the work he has done since to transform himself.

By the laws of this state it is proper that I, as Governor of the State of California, give testimony that, by completion of his sentence and good conduct in the community, Mr. Guardado merits this pardon.

Pedro Hernandez

Pedro Hernandez, a resident of California, has applied for executive clemency.

On January 6, 1994, the Superior Court of California, County of Los Angeles, sentenced Mr. Hernandez to three years of probation and 180 days in jail for second degree robbery.


Mr. Hernandez complied with the provisions of California Penal Code sections 4852.01 through 4852.22, which provide a procedure after completion of sentence to seek restoration of civic rights and responsibilities. On March 2, 2017, the Superior Court of California, County of Los Angeles, granted Mr. Hernandez a Certificate of Rehabilitation on evidence that he has been living an upright life. By granting Mr. Hernandez's petition for a Certificate of Rehabilitation, the court has recommended that Mr. Hernandez be granted a pardon.

This act of clemency for Mr. Hernandez does not minimize or forgive his conduct or the harm it caused. It does recognize the work he has done since to transform himself.

By the laws of this state it is proper that I, as Governor of the State of California, give testimony that, by completion of his sentence and good conduct in the community, Mr. Hernandez merits this pardon.

THEREFORE, I, GAVIN NEWSOM, Governor of the State of California, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and statutes of the State of California, do hereby grant to Pedro Hernandez a full and unconditional pardon.

Alim Kouliev

Alim Kouliev, a resident of California, has applied for executive clemency.

On February 5, 1999, the Superior Court of California, County of Los Angeles, sentenced Mr. Kouliev to three years of probation for driving with a blood alcohol content of 0.08 percent or higher. On March 8, 2001, the court sentenced Mr. Kouliev to three months of probation and 10 days in jail for driving without a valid driver's license. On June 18, 2003, the court sentenced Mr. Kouliev to three months of probation and 186 days in jail for felony possession of a controlled substance. The court subsequently reduced the felony conviction to a misdemeanor.

Mr. Kouliev submitted a formal application for executive clemency in the form of a gubernatorial pardon. He has provided evidence that he is living an upright life and has demonstrated his fitness for restoration of civic rights and responsibilities.

This act of clemency for Mr. Kouliev does not minimize or forgive his conduct or the harm it caused. It does recognize the work he has done since to transform himself.

By the laws of this state it is proper that I, as Governor of the State of California, give testimony that, by completion of his sentence and good conduct in the community, Mr. Kouliev merits this pardon.

THEREFORE, I, GAVIN NEWSOM, Governor of the State of California, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and statutes of the State of California, do hereby grant to Alim Kouliev a full and unconditional pardon for the above cases.

PARDON

Oscar West

Oscar West, a resident of Georgia and former resident of California, has applied for executive clemency.

On January 15, 1999, the Superior Court of California, County of Santa Clara, sentenced Mr. West to nine months of probation and nine months in jail for possession of a controlled substance and possession of controlled substance paraphernalia. On September 9, 1999, the Superior Court of California, County of Monterey, sentenced Mr. West to two years in prison for possession of a controlled substance. Mr. West's felony convictions were subsequently reduced to misdemeanors.


Mr. West has submitted to this office a formal application for executive clemency in the form of a gubernatorial pardon. He has provided evidence that he is living an upright life and has demonstrated his fitness for restoration of civic rights and responsibilities.

This act of clemency for Mr. West does not minimize or forgive his conduct or the harm it caused. It does recognize the work he has done since to transform himself, and his past service in the United States Army.

By the laws of this state it is proper that I, as Governor of the State of California, give testimony that, by completion of his sentence and good conduct in the community, Mr. West, merits this pardon.

THEREFORE, I, GAVIN NEWSOM, Governor of the State of California, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and statutes of the State of California, do hereby grant to Oscar West a full and unconditional pardon for the above cases.
