EXECUTIVE ORDER N-13-19

WHEREAS on November 8, 2018, I proclaimed a state of emergency in Butte County as a result of the Camp Fire; and

WHEREAS on November 9, 2018, I proclaimed a state of emergency in Los Angeles County and Ventura County as a result of the Hill Fire and Woolsey Fire; and

WHEREAS these wildfires have destroyed and damaged schools, displacing thousands of students; and

WHEREAS on November 28, 2018, Governor Brown issued Executive Order B-58-18, which provided significant relief to schools impacted by the wildfires; and

WHEREAS many school facilities remain inaccessible and unusable, particularly in Butte County, due to wildfire damage;

WHEREAS it is critical that all displaced students remain in temporary school facilities to ensure continuity in education; and

WHEREAS under the provisions of Government Code section 8571, I find that strict compliance with the various statutes and regulations specified in this order would prevent, hinder, or delay the mitigation of the effects of the wildfires; and

NOW, THEREFORE, I, GAVIN NEWSOM, Governor of the State of California, in accordance with the authority vested in me by the Constitution and statutes of the State of California, and in particular, Government Code sections 8567 and 8571, do hereby issue the following order to become effective immediately:

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:

1. The statutory waivers contained herein governing the activities of schools shall extend through the 2019-2020 school year, unless otherwise specified.
2. For the purposes of this Executive Order, local educational agency means: school districts, county offices of education, and charter schools.
3. Paragraphs 6 through 12, 16, and 19 of Executive Order B-58-18 are hereby extended for the duration of the 2019-2020 school year.
4. The requirement imposed by Education Code section 8275(a) that contracting agencies or facilities may be reimbursed for approvable startup costs in an amount not to exceed 15 percent of the agency's total contract amount only when costs are used to expand or increase a contracting agency's total contract amount, is waived for contracting agencies directly

impacted by the Camp Fires. The State Superintendent of Public Instruction may reimburse approval startup costs for impacted child development agencies or facilities pursuant to Education Code section 8275(a) even if the startup costs are not used to expand or increase the impacted contractor's total contract amount.

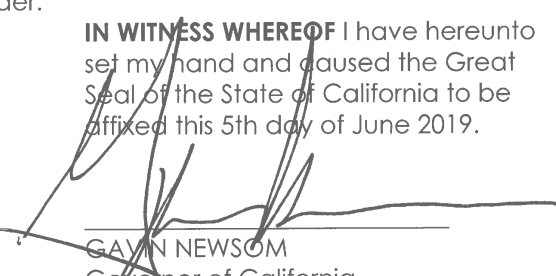
5. The requirements imposed by Education Code section 8221.5, subsections (a) through (g), are waived for agencies that were directly impacted by the Camp Fire and that contract with the California Department of Education to operate Alternative Payment Programs, CalWORKS Stage 2 and 3 Programs, or Family Child Care Home Education Network Programs. Such agencies may be reimbursed for up to 30 days from the actual date of the state-declared emergency, using the most recently certified record/invoice available, when no attendance record or invoice is available due to the Camp Fire.
6. Education Code section 60641(a), requiring that all pupils be administered academic assessments in mathematics, English language arts, and science, as provided for in Education Code section 60640, will be waived for the 2018-2019 school year for all schools in any district impacted by the fires where a federal waiver has been approved by the United States Department of Education.
7. Education Code section 60800, requiring that all pupils in grades five, seven, and nine be administered the physical performance test designated by the state board, will be waived for the 2018-2019 school year for all schools in any district impacted by the Hill, Woolsey, and Camp Fires.

This Order is not intended to, and does not, create any rights or benefits, substantive or procedural, enforceable at law or in equity, against the State of California, its agencies, departments, entities, officers, employees, or any other person.

I FURTHER DIRECT that as soon as hereafter possible, this Order be filed in the Office of the Secretary of State and that widespread publicity and notice be given of this Order.
